CHEESE JACKS RECIPE

1 LARGE CARROT
100G CHEESE
50G MARGARINE
150G OATS
HALF TSP DRIED MIXED
HERBS
1 EGG

Turn on oven to 180°C
Grate carrot and cheese
Grease baking tray
Melt margarine in a saucepan
Take pan off the heat, add
grated carrots, cheese,
mixed herbs and egg
Mix really well with a
