
### Important Dates.


#### Maths Week 2022

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### Hand Towel Initiative

Thanks for all the support with our 'Hand Towel' pilot. We have had a very positive response to it. We will continue with the pilot until Christmas and will look for parent feedback through a questionnaire, before the Christmas holidays.

Our reasoning behind this initiative is:

To reduce our blue roll waste, which currently stands at 20 black bags per week.

To provide a safe and hygienic way for children to dry their hands sustainably.

To reduce the amount we are spending on blue roll - while the Department of Education is still providing a 'Covid Grant', that grant has not increased and the cost of blue roll has doubled. We will continue to provide blue roll for children who may forget their towels. We will also provide some spare towels for children where needed.



### Science Week 2022

Science Week took place in Scoil Maelruain Junior earlier this month. The week aimed to celebrate the role of Science in our everyday lives.

The children took part in many experiments from magnets, sinking and floating and testing heart-rate to name but a few.

Second class students, Effrain Varghese and Sofia Kennedy outline their experience of participating in the initiative.

"I was on the Science Team and my job was re-setting tables with experiments. I was setting up the magnets table. Each class came to the halla at a different time and day." **Sofia Kennedy** 

"Some of the experiments were static electricity, lightopaque/translucent/transparent, floating finger, how magnets attract and repel each other, how plants drink and floating/sinking. My favourite experiment was the floating finger." **Efrain Varghese** 





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### Health & Safety Reminder



We would like to thank all the parents and students who have followed our health and safety reminders so far. Just a couple of further reminders that we would like to bring to your attention:

- There is no parking at the school. We have had a number of complaints from local residents about people blocking their houses entry at drop off and collection each day. Children who are walking, cycling and scooting to school are also in danger of being hit by moving vehicles. We would appreciate it if you could walk, cycle or scoot where possible. If you have to drive we would appreciate it if you could park at the church car park and walk to the school.
- While the school grounds are open for staff access in the mornings we would encourage children to arrive from **8.40am or later**.
- If you need to access the grounds during the school hours please ensure that the gates are left closed behind you.
- Wet Days: children should arrive at school at 8.50am and later. If they do get to school before that there are shelters by each door. As we all know the weather in Ireland is very changeable so we would encourage all children to have a raincoat in their bags or wear a coat each day.
- We would ask that children **dismount** their 'vehicles' at the school gates and walk them through the school grounds.

Your children's safety is paramount, and we appreciate your support with these measures.

Teachers are unable to speak with parents at the doors in the morning. Communication with teachers is done through **email**.

Teachers will review their emails at the end of the school day.

They will then email you an e-form which you must return within 7 days otherwise the form will expire and you will need to begin the process all over again. When the 'Vetting' comes through you will be informed by Archbishop's House and the Declaration will also be sent to the school.

#### **Fundraising**
